

JANUARY 2011 BLOCK OF THE MONTH PATTERN: DOUBLE WINDMILL 2

Pattern from www.quilterscache.com

Use white-on-white fabric for background and half of center pinwheel, dark blue fabric for other half of center pinwheel, and blue-and-white print (medium or small print) for half of larger pinwheel.

This is a paper pieced block so if you are not familiar with paper piecing, you can check out the practice paper piecing page on this website. You will need to print out 4 paper-piecing templates to make the block. , Keep the paper on until you sew all 4 squares together. Also, be sure to measure the 1-inch test square to ensure your patterns have printed out at the correct size. If you have any questions, call Carol Stanley 849-2949.

COUNTDOWN BEGINS TO 2011 QUILT SHOW

The quilt show committee met on January 13th in preparation for the guild meeting on the 19th. Although things are moving along, there are still many ways guild members can help. Continue reading and see if there is a job that might be perfect for you.

First and foremost, we need quilts!!! If you have a quilt or two you'd like to enter, there is a registration form in this newsletter that you can use. Jen Martin is in charge of quilt registration and quilt layout so please get your registration forms to Jen as soon as possible. There will be cameras at the January guild meeting to take pictures of those members who need to do so in order to have a picture to submit with the registration form.

Second, we need volunteers!!! Bonnie Evans is in charge of getting volunteers for all the jobs. She will have a sign-up sheet at the January meeting and will be trying to fill the majority of the jobs then. So bring your personal calendars and sign-up for at least one job at the Quilt Show.

Third, we need donations!!! The Silent Auction needs more quilted or quilt-related items for the Silent Auction table. Table runners/toppers, matching placemats and napkins, bags and totes, wall-hangings, quilt kits, and gift baskets have all been popular sellers in the past. If you have an item

to donate, give them to Nancy Orcutt at the guild meeting. We also need donations for the door prize. The door prize can be won by a non-quilter so items like candles, soaps, lotions, tea, coffee, etc, are always welcomed. Additionally, we need a guild member to step forward and organize the door prize basket. Finally, we need fat quarter donations for the basket of FQs we use as a prize for the raffle.

Fourth, Lorraine Pike is looking for members to do a demo during the quilt show. If you have an easy or unique technique or project you'd like to demo, talk to Lorraine at the meeting or contact her at Lorraine 849-6683 or lipike@wildblue.net.

Fifth, Nadine Froebel is the raffle ticket coordinator this year. She asks that each member return the raffle tickets and money for the tickets in an envelope with the member's name written on the outside. Nadine wants to be sure to properly credit the returned tickets and money to the correct member and avoid making unnecessary telephone calls looking for unreturned tickets.

Sixth, Elaine Magnan issued a challenge to all guild members to complete a Vermont quilt using at least 6 blocks (remember Champ???) from the 2009-2010 Block of the Month program.

Finally, we need a variety of charity quilts made throughout the year for the quilt display in the front lobby. We want to fill the lobby with quilts and welcome visitors to the show.

VOF ANNOUNCES CALL FOR QUILT ENTRIES

The Vermont Quilt Festival will be accepting 2011 contest entry applications postmarked from February 1st – February 15th. Here's the link to the entry form, http://www.vqf.org/files/%202011%20Contest%20Entry%20Form_doc.pdf

2011 marks the 33^{rd} year for the Vermont Quilt Festival contest. The theme category for 2011 is Yankee Ingenuity. Entries from all over the United States, Canada and abroad are exhibited. As a reminder, VQF is not a juried show. There are nine categories and include one for beginner quilters and one for youth. Nineteen named awards and a possible twelve others are presented at the opening night on June 23^{rd} . The Festival will be open to the public June 24^{th} – June 26^{th} at the Champlain Valley Expo in Essex Junction. Class registration will open at the beginning of March.

QUILT TIP

Whenever you draft an original pattern or make changes in an existing pattern, always work without seam allowances. After you figure the math (or drawings) for your borders and blocks, then add the seam allowances. This will minimize confusion and will let you concentrate on design.

MORE QUILT TIPS

To wash or not to wash, that is the question... This has been a perennial discussion in the quilting industry, but here's a tip from the internet that might sway those "not to wash" believers to start washing their fabric purchases: "Several years ago my sewing room was making me ill, truly ill. I talked with a friend about this and she suggested although I didn't notice odors from fabric finishes, such as formaldehyde, because I didn't pre-wash my fabrics this could definitely be the cause. I am a true fabriholic and have a very large stash. I removed and washed my stash. That must have been the reason for the headache and sick feeling because now I am free to go in there and I feel OK when I do. Now nothing goes upstairs to my sewing room until it stops in the laundry room and is washed!!" Penny Holliday
