**Present:** Total attended 40, no new members, no guests. *Proceedings:* 

Meeting called to order at 7:05 p.m. by Ann Jacobs, President.

**Secretary's Report:** Minutes of December 15, 2010 Meeting, motion to accept by Joanne Sweet, seconded by Gail Darling; motion carried.

**Treasurer's Report:** Motion to accept by Nancy Orcutt, seconded by Peggy Burbank; motion carried.

#### Old Business:

**For Sale Table** is back. Take a look, and make a deal. If you previously purchased a book that was lacking the templates, Sharon Perry has them.

**Charity Quilt 2011:** Sally Krupp and Nadine Froebel showed completed strips sewn together into joined rows = 1/2 finished quilt top. They still have more foundation pieces available. They need strips returned no later than the February meeting.

Quilt Show: Roberta Gilmour reported that WE NEED QUILTS for the show! The only restrictions are that they should not have been in our show previously, and that an FCQG member must have participated in constructing or quilting the quilt. Sharon Perry encouraged everyone to put a quilt in the show, even very simple ones which might be of more interest to some viewers and newbie quilters. Quilt registration forms are in the newsletter.

- I SPY QUILTS ON MAIN STREET: Roberta announced that businesses she has contacted are excited about displaying our quilts. Some would like to display them even longer, possibly through the Maple Festival. Choose a business and sign up with Roberta. If your displayed quilt(s) is not for sale, tag NSF. Otherwise, leave contact information and price with the business.
- RAFFLE TICKETS: Nadine has more tickets available, and appreciates your returns in labeled envelopes as instructed.
- SILENT AUCTION: Nancy Orcutt needs items for the silent auction. Think kits, fat quarters, handmade items (bags, placemats, table runners, etc.). So far, we have five items.
- VOLUNTEERS: Bonnie Evans sent around a sheet for members to sign up for jobs at the quilt show.
- CHARITY QUILT DISPLAY: Ann Jacobs reminded us that we need some charity quilts for the display in the City Hall foyer at the show. Summer Ladd will be helping Ann with this, since Ann has quarter-end work obligations.
- POSTERS: Sharon Perry brought small and large posters to put in businesses and elsewhere. Put one facing out in your car window (back seat behind driver).
- RIBBONS: Roberta asked for the ribbons to be finished and returned at the February meeting.

DEMOS: Lorraine Pike needs volunteers for demos at the show.

DOOR PRIZE DONATIONS: Lorraine is also collecting items for the door prize.

#### Block of the Month:

- Fourteen blue and white blocks were submitted for the January block raffle, which was won by Rolande Fortin.
- The February block is the Martha Washington Star (in honor of Presidents' Month). Use red, white-on-white, and dark blue fabric. Printed instructions were available at the meeting and will be in the newsletter.

<u>Other monthly Drawings</u>: Door prize won by ??, charity quilt raffle won by Elaine Magnan.

#### Other Business:

- Ann Jacobs read thank-you notes from the Franklin County Humane Society for pet pillows made from fabric scraps, and from Voices Against Violence (Laurie's House) for charity quilts.
- Ann welcomed vendor Forever Bloom, and encouraged members to shop after the meeting.
- Next meeting on Wednesday, February 16 at 7:00 p.m. Program will be a fabric exchange. Bring at least 3 squares (cut 3 inches, cut 5 inches, or cut 10 inches, or one of each).

To celebrate the birthday of a quilting friend, use a "jelly roll" (try cutting your own "jelly roll" strips), insert candles, and present it as birthday cake for your quilter friend, with the fabrics being the gift for her to make a new project and your gift being the jelly roll fabric for her to make a project.

**NOTE:** Don't light the candles...it's just a fun gift presentation!

# FEBRUARY 2011 BLOCK OF THE MONTH PATTERN: MARTHA WASHINGTON STAR

# Use white-on-white fabric for background, dark blue fabric for the star points, and red for the small pinwheel in the center of the star.

If you follow the cutting instructions on page 3 at the link below, you'll cut the strip for Color 1 in your dark blue fabric. The square for Color 1 in the instructions should be your red fabric. If you have any questions, call Carol Stanley 849-2949.

#### 55 DAYS & COUNTING: COUNTDOWN CONTINUES TO 2011 QUILT SHOW

The quilt show committee will meet on February 10<sup>th</sup> to continue preparations for the quilt show. There are still many ways guild members can help. Continue reading and see if there is a job that might be perfect for you.

With the quilt show less than 7 weeks away, we still need quilts!!! We can't have a quilt show unless we have quilts to display. If you have a quilt or two you'd like to enter, there is a registration form in this newsletter that you can use. Jen Martin is in charge of quilt registration and quilt layout so please get your registration forms to Jen as soon as possible. There will be cameras again at the February guild meeting to take pictures for those members who need to do so in order to have a picture to submit with the registration form. See Sharon Perry at the meeting, and she'll take a picture for you.

We still need volunteers too!!! Bonnie Evans is in charge of getting volunteers for all the jobs. She'll have the sign-up sheet at the February meeting and will be trying to fill the remaining jobs. The jobs available are varied and only require a small amount of time. So bring your personal calendars and sign-up for at least one job at the Quilt Show.

We also need donations!!! The Silent Auction needs more quilted or quilt-related items for the Silent Auction table; right now we only have five items. Table runners/toppers, matching placemats and napkins, bags and totes, wall-hangings, quilt kits, and gift baskets have all been popular sellers in the past. If you have an item to donate, give them to Nancy Orcutt at the guild meeting. We also need donations for the door prize. The door prize can be won by a non-quilter so items like candles, soaps, lotions, tea,

coffee, etc, are always welcomed. Finally, we need **fat quarter donations** for the basket of FQs we use as a prize for the raffle.

We need members to do a few demos!!! Lorraine Pike is looking for members to do a demo during the quilt show. If you have an easy or unique technique or project you'd like to demo, talk to Lorraine at the meeting or contact her at Lorraine 849-6683 or lipike@wildblue.net.

We also need members to adopt a business or two for I Spy Quilts!!! This is an easy way to provide very visible publicity for the quilt show and to support the local businesses on Main Street with increased foot traffic. If you have some quilts you could "loan" for this effort, please see Roberta Gilmour.

Raffle tickets and money need to be returned to Nadine Froebel, the raffle ticket coordinator this year. She asks that each member return the raffle tickets and money for the tickets in an envelope with the member's name written on the outside. Nadine wants to be sure to properly credit the returned tickets and money to the correct member and avoid making unnecessary telephone calls looking for unreturned tickets.

<u>Ouilts!!!</u> Elaine Magnan issued a challenge to all guild members to complete a Vermont quilt using at least 6 blocks (remember Champ???) from the 2009-2010 Block of the Month program.

<u>We need all ribbons returned</u> to Roberta Gilmour or Deb Aylward at the February meeting. If you took a ribbon to complete, be sure to return it at the meeting.

Last but not least, we need a variety of charity quilts made throughout the year for the quilt display in the front lobby. We want to fill the lobby with quilts and welcome visitors to the show.

#### QUILT TIPS

- When a spool of thread has only has a yard or two left, save it in a container with the other supplies needed to do hand sewing (usually for binding a quilt). Then use the remainder of thread on each spool for all your hand sewing needs, therefore never wasting thread.
- Use a front door peep-hole (available in hardware stores), to view how your quilt will look at a distance and from various angles. It gives a good perspective of the quilt, including block placement, color balance, etc.
