Meeting called to order at 7:05 p.m. by Roseanne Terrill, President.

Secretary's Report for January meeting: Motion to accept by Sharon Perry, seconded by Ann Jacobs

Old Business

- Membership Char Mulyca has membership rosters for those who never got one. Mary Jane Palmer's email is correct and has been fixed. Dale McFeeters' phone number should be corrected to read 524-3616.
 Susie Perry is moving to Florida; tonight was her last meeting.:(
- April meeting and workshop The guild was reminded that the April meeting is scheduled for FRIDAY, APRIL 25th, (NOT the usual 3rd Wednesday of the month). The program will be a trunk show by guest Kay Berquist, who will also lead a workshop on Saturday, April 26. There are still spaces in the Crazy Quilt Table Runner workshop. Carolyn Kittell announced that workshop registration has been lowered to \$20 for FCQG members. If the workshop does not fill, the remaining spaces will be opened to area guilds at \$25 per person.

- Quilt Show

- The final count is 136 registered quilts for the show!
 Kay Benedict distributed quilt ID slips and reviewed drop-off instructions.
- Denise announced that charity quilts are needed for the show.
- There are still a few unfilled slots on the appraiser's schedule. The complete list will be on our website.
- Bonnie Evans filled the last few volunteer slots on the show schedule. The complete list can be found on our website.
- Sally Krupp reported that 27 items have been submitted for the Silent Auction, with a few more expected by meeting's end.
- Diane Forey collected all outstanding raffle tickets and money.
- Gwen Guyette received enough fat quarters for two baskets.
- A crew of husbands, sons, and other strong guys are still needed for Friday pole setup and Sunday takedown. BYO 6'-8' stepladders and small ratchet sets, if you have them
- <u>Raffle Quit 2015</u> Denise Chase announced that the quilt is almost finished.

New Business

- Roseanne Terrill delivered a rousing presidential speech, thanking the guild for all they do for the community, and encouraging them to continue contributing their time, talent, and treasure to the guild.
- It was announced that the guild donated quilts to the Paquette family of Bakersfield, whose home was recently destroyed in a fire.
- <u>Nominating Committee</u> Roseanne Terrill filled all but 2 slots on the slate of officers for next year, so a nominating committee is probably not needed. What we DO need is a Program Chair. Also, we need to ask Jen Burt if she wants to chair the Purple Heart quilts again next year.

- 2015 Charity Quilt

- Roseanne Terrill reported that she has received two letters from organizations requesting consideration for the quilt. Deadline for any others is June 10.
- Char Mulyca asked that guild members donate medium to dark batiks, cut in 3-inch strips WOF for the quilt.
- <u>Block of the Month</u> For the April block (Carrie Nation), use "spring pink," black, and cream. Instructions from Quilter's Cache were distributed.

- Ann Jacobs: For free motion quilting, Leah Day recommends that you reduce stitch length to zero and don't drop the feed dogs.

...AND THE WINNERS ARE...

The Franklin County Quilters Guild hosted its 16th Annual Quilt Show at St. Albans City Hall this past weekend. With a record number of quilts entered, the auditorium was filled to capacity with 142 unique and colorful quilts.

To commemorate the upcoming 150th anniversary of the 1864 St. Albans Raid, the show featured replica quilts inspired by Vermonter Jane A. Stickle's Civil War era quilt owned by the Bennington Museum. The special display included six entries in this year's challenge as well as a prize-winning bed-size quilt created by Dale McFeeters and another bed-size display quilt completed by Bonnie Evans. A fascinating attraction at the show featured guild member Denise Chase of St. Albans demonstrating hand quilting on her Stickle reproduction quilt.

For the second year, the guild invited certified quilt appraiser, Sandra Palmer of Woodstock, to provide quilt appraisals for both antique and contemporary quilts. Along with her apprentice, guild member Pam Salazar, guild members and community members brought their treasured quilts in over the weekend and experienced the appraiser's expert input. She saw many remarkable

quilts and plans to return next year for another round of appraisals.

Mayor Liz Gamache stopped by the quilt show Saturday morning to select her favorite for the Mayor's Award. Mayor Gamache presented the award to Denise Chase for her quilt, "Oh My Heavenly Stars I." Chase also made a second quilt, "Oh My Heavenly Stars II," which won the Founder's Award. Chase made two identical quilts for twin beds in her home. She hand quilted Stars I and machine quilted Stars II; each quilt contained 6996 pieces. Denise Quint, of Gorham, Maine, organized the first ever Franklin County Quilt Show in 1999 and served as the show's chairwoman for five consecutive years. It was a highlight for the guild to have Ouint attend the show and present the Founder's Award to Chase. Guild president, Roseanne Terrill of Milton, selected "Sunflower Illusions" by Rolande Fortin for the President's Award.

Eighteen additional awards were presented during the show and guild members proudly accepted the ribbons to accompany their quilts. Raffle drawings were conducted at the conclusion of the quilt show and the winners are: queen-sized quilt, Linda Jarvis of Swanton; large basket of fabric, Connie Lane of St. Albans; 2nd basket of fabric, June Sheridan of East Fairfield; and Hannaford gift certificate, Jeannette LaPierre of Fairfax. Theresa Snider of Richford won the door prize.


SATURDAY WORKSHOP: CRAZY RUNNER

FABRIC STRIPS NEEDED FOR 2015 CHARITY QUILT

Char and Christy Mulyca have graciously offered to make the 2015 Charity Quilt. Guild members selected the pattern at a previous meeting.

To make the quilt, Char and Christy are asking guild members to donate 3-inch WOF* strips in medium and dark batiks in any color. They will be collecting the strips at the April meeting.

*WOF = width of fabric

QUILT TIPS

- If you've been eating at your sewing machine and you've got a spot of grease on your material, don't panic. Use a piece of chalk to get rid of the stain. Just rub it over the area, leave for a few minutes, then brush off. The spot will disappear like magic.


