Color 1

Color 2

Color 1 needs: one 2-1/2" x 30" strip AND one 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strip

Color 2 needs: one 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" strip and one 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strip


** Preparing the Pieces and Sewing the Block **



squares. Stack those 2-7/8" squares and cut them in half once on the squares. Then cut the Color 1 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strip into four 2-7/8" Start by cutting the Color 1 2-1/2" x 30" strip into twelve 2-1/2" diagonal to make eight half square triangles..



Color 2 2-7/8" x 11-1/2" strip into four 2-7/8" squares. Stack those 2-7/8" squares Next cut the Color 2 2-1/2" x 12-1/2" strip into five 2-1/2" squares, then cut the and cut them once on the diagonal to make eight half square triangles

VERMONT QUILT FESTIVAL PIONEER AS GUEST SPEAKER IN MAY

Richard Cleveland, founder of the Vermont Quilt Festival, will be the guest speaker at the guild's meeting on Wednesday, May 20th. Cleveland refers to himself as a "Quilt Bureaucrat" and "textile detective." He also admits he "has only one real passion, and that's antique quilts." Cleveland will be sharing that passion and using his detective skills as he views and discusses the vintage and antique quilts of guild members at the May meeting.

Cleveland studied to be a history teacher, and history has always been his favorite subject. He confesses, "I want to see as many antique quilts as I can, to know as much about them as possible, and to see them preserved for generations to come." In an interview about 15 years ago, Cleveland also revealed, "Sometimes when I find a quilt I especially like, I run the tips of my fingers gently over its surface, willing it to tell me its secrets. I ask the six questions of every reporter - and historian: Who, what, why, how, when, where. Alas, most quilts never disgorge this information to us, and perhaps their mystery is part of their attraction for me."

In addition to organizing and leading the Vermont Quilt Cleveland initiated a statewide quilt Festival. documentation project, the Vermont Quiltsearch. He also co-authored the book, Plain and Fancy: Vermont's People and Their Quilts, with Donna Bister. The book was published in 1991, Vermont's bicentennial. Cleveland feels "the most important thing I ever did was to arrange the exhibition of the Plain and Fancy quilts at the Vermont State House on July 4 and 5, 1991. That was the summer the book came out, and the exhibition was the weekend prior to the 15th annual Festival. Most of the [quilt] owners were present for the State House opening, and for most it was the first time they realized just how important their quilts were, how much their quilts were a part of Vermont history, and the degree to which other people cared about them."

Guild members are encouraged to bring any antique or vintage quilt made before 1960 to the May meeting. Cleveland will display each quilt as he dates it and talks about the fabrics and techniques used to make the quilt. This program is sure to please everyone as guild members learn more about the heritage and history of their family heirlooms. This meeting is not to be missed. As a reminder, Cleveland's program will begin promptly at 7:00 pm.

QUILT SHOW WINNERS ANNOUNCED

The Franklin County Quilters Guild hosted its 17th

Annual Quilt Show at St. Albans City Hall on April 11th and 12th. The well-attended event brought nearly 600 visitors to view the 118 unique and colorful quilts that filled the auditorium.

This year's challenge issued to members of the Guild was to create a small quilt or wall hanging no larger than 42" x 42". The theme for the challenge was "I Never Met a Red I Didn't Like" and many of the members entered a piece for display. Their entries ranged from traditional piecework to English paper piecing to art quilts. The small quilts also needed to limit their fabrics to only shades of red with white or cream as an accent. The final effect was eye candy to visitors as they walked through the entrance hallway to the auditorium.

For the third year, the guild invited certified quilt appraiser, Sandra Palmer of Woodstock, to provide quilt appraisals for both antique and contemporary quilts. Along with her apprentice, guild member Pam Salazar, she offered expert input on the treasured quilts brought in during the weekend by guild and community members. She appraised many remarkable quilts and shared stories about the fabrics and patterns that appeared in the antique quilts she pored over.

Mayor Liz Gamache stopped by the quilt show to select her favorite for the Mayor's Award. Mayor Gamache presented the award to Nancy LaPointe for her quilt, "Midnight at the Oasis". The stunning quilt featured a variety of techniques along with intricate quilting. Denise Quint of Gorham, Maine, organized the first-ever Franklin County Quilt Show in 1999 and served as the show's chairwoman for five consecutive years. While Quint was unable to attend this year's show, she asked Nancy Orcutt of St. Albans to select a quilt in her absence. Orcutt presented a ribbon to "Lake Effect" by Jean Anne Branch. Guild president, Helen Short of St. Albans, selected "Up North" by Shirley Babcock for the The extremely involved wall President's Award. hanging depicted a view of a lake with flowers and a quilt blowing in the wind.

Eighteen additional awards were presented during the show and guild members proudly accepted the ribbons to accompany their quilts. Raffle drawings were conducted at the conclusion of the quilt show and the winners are: queen-sized quilt, Rose Rixon; large basket of fabric, Chris Toloro of Colchester; and a Hannaford gift certificate, Pauline Kehoe of Milton. The door prize was won by Wendy Thompson of Colchester.
