November 14, 2018 Franklin County Quilters Guild Meeting Minutes

Meeting called to order at 6:30 by President John Rouleau. 39 members were present, 2 of which were new members. There were 2 guests present. John announced that there were loose leaf notebooks on the tables with pictures and other memorabilia for members to peruse. He asked for a volunteer to be the Guild's Historian. No one volunteered at the meeting. If this role appeals to you, please let John know at 802-658-1438. Website-Our website is now in the Guild's Treasurer's name and Allie Bowen will start to update it. Please review it for information about the Guild and to view the pictures of our quilts.

Support of Other Community Endeavors:

Bonnie Evans announced that she had tickets for a Raffle Quilt being offered by the NMC Auxiliary. She also reported that she had received a request from an



Alzheimer's Organization for the Guild to make a quilt for them to raffle off to support their programs. As the 2019 Charity Quilt recipent has already been selected, Sally Krupp volunteered to make a quilt for them.

Business Meeting: The minutes of the October Meeting and the Treasurer's Report were approved as written on a motion by Denise Chase and second by Diane Forey.

Nancy LaPointe announced that the **2019 Quilt Show** is scheduled for Saturday, April 6th and Sunday, April 7th with set up on Friday April 5^{*}. The Show will again be held at City Hall and because of our nonprofit status, the Guild is renting at daily rate much lower than the city charges for other renters who do not have 501C3's. Donations are being accepted for the Tea Cup Auction. Kay Benedict plans a special display of the barn quilts members have made and this year's Quilt Registration Form is on the website and in the November Newsletter. So far, there have been only four quilts entered in the quilt show. Please get you quilts registered as soon as possible so Kay can start planning how they will be displayed in order to showcase your entry. Denise Chase has some labels for **Comfort Quilts** and Penny LaRochelle will get labels printed. Denise has fabric stored at her house and a few kits. Please contact her at 802-370-1104 to arrange a time to stop by to pick up fabric to make a Comfort Quilt. Queen sized quilts are needed for Fires and Other Disasters. Smaller quilts are used for the Guild's other programs. Penny LaRochelle will have **membership cards** ready for paid members in December. She asks that we **keep our lanyards** with our name cards and wear them to each meeting. **She will collect them in June**.

The Program this month was demos of by members of items that can be made for the Holiday Season. **Jessica VanDenburg of Sew Many Creations** is coming in March and Kris Kilburn requested that members review her website and email Kris on the project you would like her to teach at the weekend workshop.

Mary King donated a Barn Quilt for the Guild to raffle to support programs for the membership. *Members are urged to come to December's meeting with ideas about how the raffle is to be conducted.*

Block of the Month- Beth Jessiman introduced *Maple Leaf as the BOM for December*. Fall colors are requested with a white background. Your block should come out at 12.5 inches so it will finish at 12 inches. The instructions are on Quilter's Cache and Beth had some hard copies that she passed out at the meeting.

Monica Kelly won the Membership Raffle. Members showed the Comfort Quilts and Personal Quilts that they made. Following Show and Tell the meeting was adjourned.
